How to Resolve a Complaint with Your Mortgage Broker or Agent

If you have a complaint with your Mortgage Broker or Agent regarding non-compliance with the Mortgage Broker Law, there are steps you can take:

- Contact the Mortgage Brokerage that employs the Mortgage Broker or Agent to discuss your complaint.
- If your complaint cannot be resolved, get the Mortgage Brokerage's final position in writing.
- Once you receive the final position, you have the option of contacting FSCO. Visit FSCO's website at www.fsco.gov.on.ca to download the *Mortgage Business Activity Complaint Form*. On the form, make sure you describe your complaint, why you disagree with the company's position, and include the Mortgage Brokerage's final position letter. FSCO will review and respond to your complaint.
